Recipes from the Archives

Highland Scones

To I lb flour allow from 2 to 4 oz of butter or lard as much hot water as will make a dough of flour, and two beaten eggs, if the cakes are wished to rise. Handle quickly, and roll out and cut in any shape or size wanted. Bake on the griddle or on a thick-bottomed frying pan. Must be served hot and eaten fresh.
